Following an application process which includes development plans and assessments, formal training for officership consists of either residential learning at William Booth College or Distance Learning. Training involves practical and academic studies both on campus and on placement at


different Salvation Army settings.

Following commissioning, training continues with five years of the Into Officership programme and, of course, is followed by a lifetime of learning and development.

SALUTE



The Salvation Army salute, which is the raising of the right hand with the index finger pointing upwards, symbolically recognises that everything we do is because of who God is and what God has done for us.



The Declaration of Faith is the recital of the eleven doctrines - key beliefs and teachings - of The Salvation Army. The doctrines explore and define (as best we can) our understanding of God, humanity and Christian life. They are unique to
The Salvation Army, but they
share a common emphasis
with other Christian traditions.
They are the foundation of
faith, providing a benchmark
which helps Salvationists to
live out their faith.



One definition of a covenant is a solemn and sacred agreement or mutual promise between two or more parties.

A few days prior to the ordination and commissioning, in a very special service at William Booth College, each cadet signs a covenant - a promise to love and serve God, and to faithfully fulfil the duties and responsibilities of an officer in The Salvation Army.



Each cadet will affirm their faith and declare their intention to be loyal to the truths of scripture as they are ordained as ministers and commissioned to serve as Salvation Army officers.





Newly commissioned officers are appointed as spiritual leaders in various communities and contexts around the country. Each of them commits to serving everyone in the name of Christ.

SALVATION ARMY OFFICER'S COVENANT

DECLARATION OF FAITH

In the name of God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit, and in the presence of the officers, soldiers, adherents and friends of The Salvation Army here assembled, we declare that:

WE BELIEVE that the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments were given by inspiration of God, and that they only constitute the Divine rule of Christian faith and practice.

WE BELIEVE that there is only one God, who is infinitely perfect, the Creator, Preserver, and Governor of all things, and who is the only proper object of religious worship.

WE BELIEVE that there are three persons in the Godhead - the Father, the Son and the Holy Ghost, undivided in essence and co-equal in power and glory.

WE BELIEVE that in the person of Jesus Christ the Divine and human natures are united, so that he is truly and properly God and truly and properly man.

WE BELIEVE that our first parents were created in a state of innocency, but by their disobedience they lost their purity and happiness, and that in consequence of their fall all men have become sinners, totally deprayed, and as such are justly exposed to the wrath of God.

WE BELIEVE that the Lord Jesus Christ has by his suffering and death made an atonement for the whole world so that whosoever will may be saved.

WE BELIEVE that repentance towards God, faith in our Lord Jesus Christ, and regeneration by the Holy Spirit, are necessary to salvation.

WE BELIEVE that we are justified by grace through faith in our Lord Jesus Christ and that he that believeth hath the witness in himself.

WE BELIEVE that continuance in a state of salvation depends upon continued obedient faith in Christ.

WE BELIEVE that it is the privilege of all believers to be wholly sanctified, and that their whole spirit and soul and body may be preserved blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

WE BELIEVE in the immortality of the soul; in the resurrection of the body; in the general judgment at the end of the world; in the eternal happiness of the righteous; and in the endless punishment of the wicked.

CHARGE AND RESPONSE

CHIEF SECRETARY Do you promise to maintain and proclaim these truths?

CADETS We do!

CHIEF SECRETARY Do you regard it as your duty to bear this witness everywhere, to strive to

lead all persons to their only Saviour, and for his sake to care for the poor, feed the hungry, clothe the naked, love the unloved and befriend those

CADETS We do!

CHIEF SECRETARY Do you promise by holy living, boundless charity, and adherence to the

principles and discipline of the Army to show yourselves at all times to

be faithful officers of The Salvation Army?

CADETS We do!

CHIEF SECRETARY In the name of God, I accept the declarations and promises you have made

this day. We will now proceed with your ordination and commissioning.

ORDINATION AND COMMISSIONING

We rejoice that God has called you, has equipped you and gifted you for sacred service and therefore affirm that you are ordained as a minister of the gospel of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, and I now commission you as an officer of The Salvation Army with the rank of lieutenant.

GOOD NEWSFROM WILLIAM BOOTH COLLEGE


William Booth College (WBC) might just be more than you realise! Of course, the training of cadets for Salvation Army ministry is a vital aspect of what we do. But WBC facilitates learning and vocational and professional development across The Salvation Army in the UK and Ireland (UKI) and beyond. Here are just a few insights into the life and work of WBC.



KEEPING CHRIST AT THE CENTRE!

Christlikeness, Mission,
Community, and Hospitality are
WBC's core values. The Spiritual
Life Unit supports these in many
different ways. Recently we opened
our doors to a local school for a tour
of the International Heritage Centre
and WBC site, in the first of many
such outreach events.

Another exciting development is the imminent opening of a Retreat Centre at WBC. This will provide a beautiful space for reflection and sanctuary for the college, the local community, and the UKI Territory.



KNOWING, BEING, DOING

The integration of 'knowing, being and doing' has always been at the heart of officer training, but the Foundational Learning team has been looking at creative ways to develop this further. This year, first-year cadets have been engaged in attachment placements with a local corps for the whole year, which has meant many aspects of the training programme have been delivered in practical settings alongside corps officers. We have been very grateful for the corps officers involved and the team at London Divisional Headquarters for supporting with this.

OPEN LEARNING

ENJOY YOUR STUDIES! DEVELOP YOUR FAITH! INCREASE YOUR KNOWLEDGE!

Open Learning provides over 100 correspondence courses for adults of any age and ability, whether part of The Salvation Army or not. There are currently over 90 students, including those serving time in 22 HMP establishments. Courses, which are at three levels, explore such topics as the Bible, Christian Life, the beliefs and mission of the Church, pastoral care, spiritual formation, world religions, ethics and the interaction of faith with the big issues of life. An excellent team of tutors offer feedback and encouragement along the learning journey.

VOCATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

EQUIPPING LEADERS TO LEAD

This year, 58 territorial envoys completed the Territorial Envoy Programme. Each year, 84 officers and envoys, supported by 42 coaches and eight Learning and Development Officers, attend one of seven Vocational Development Pathway workshops.

There are currently 90 lieutenants and cadets being supported in their early years of ministry through the Into Officership programme, and each year the Leader Development Programme equips 18 officers and envoys, who are further on in ministry, to be more effective spiritual leaders.

The unit currently supports 19 chaplains across the range of The Salvation Army's work, as well as 30 employed spiritual leaders, involved in local corps and pioneer leadership.

HIGHER EDUCATION

For officers wishing to top-up their DipHE in Salvation Army Officer Training, WBC offers the BA (Hons) Christian Theology and Practice. Now into its eighth cohort, and with 20 students in the current cohort, this degree is delivered part-time over two years, alongside officers' full-time ministerial roles.





In May, WBC along with the graduates' families and friends, celebrated the graduation of those who had completed the BA/BA (Hons) Pastoral Care with Psychology and the BA (Hons) Christian Theology and Practice degree programmes.

EUROPEAN LIEUTENANTS' GATHERING

FELLOWSHIP ACROSS BORDERS

In March WBC hosted 68 delegates from 13 countries for the inaugural European Lieutenants Gathering, consisting of worship, teaching and visits to International Headquarters, St Paul's Cathedral and sites of significance from the early days of the Army.

LEARNING AND DEVELOPMENT

The Learning and Development Unit supports spiritual leaders and employees across the UK and Ireland Territory to access training courses and other development opportunities.

This year we have facilitated 131 learning cohorts, with courses ranging from productivity skills development to understanding the causes and consequences of substance use. These courses are either facilitated online, at regional services such as Lifehouses, or at WBC. In the Autumn and Spring terms, 817 learners were supported from all departments and services offered across The Salvation Army.
