William Booth was one of the Founders of The Salvation Army.

## KEY DATES

- 1829 Born in Nottingham on 10 April.
- **1842** Leaves school. Becomes an assistant pawnbroker.
- 1844 Becomes a Christian. **Preaches** in the streets.
- **1849** Moves to London for work. Still preaching on the streets.
- 1851 Meets Catherine Mumford.
- 1854 Completes training to be a full-time minister
- 1855 William and Catherine marry.
- 1861 Leaves the church to be a travelling preacher.
- **1865** Is asked to lead The Christian Mission
- 1878 Changes the name to The Salvation Army.
- 1890 Catherine dies. Publishes *In Darkest* England and the Way Out.
- 1912 William dies. Their son, Bramwell, is the next General.

In the 1900's I went round the world to see all we had done. In the UK I travelled by car, and crowds flocked to see!

preached about God's love for everyone, and spoke on the streets so I could reach people who didn't come to church. Then I met **Catherine Mumford**. She challenged some of my ideas and encouraged me to become a full-time minister.

After we married, I got a job as a travelling preacher. It was hard work but we loved it. We understood that people needed not just words, but practical help, so they could aim for a better life.

When the church wanted me to work in only one place. we knew it was time for us to leave, to be independent. I was preaching outside a pub in East London when I was invited to speak to a group, The Christian Mission. They were **inspired by our ideas** and asked us to lead them. Together we took action to help people and to show God's love for them. We became a new church and charity -The Salvation Army – dedicated to love God and love others.
