Welcome to Grow: The Children & Youth Leaders' Conference 2025. We're looking forward to sharing in this weekend with you.

When we look at an acorn, we are reminded of the mystery that something so small holds the potential to become something mighty. This seed could become a tree. And not just any tree, but an oak tree! 
What you need to know

Coventry is on the West Coast Mainline and serviced by regular trains, seven days a week.




Regular buses from the university campus to Coventry city centre and rail station. Taxis are available at the bus terminal.

Commissioners Paul & Jenine Main Territorial Leaders, UK & Ireland



Paul and Jenine Main have served as Salvation Army officers for 39 years. They met at the Training College in 1986 and married later that year. Their officership has taken them to various locations in the UK, including London, Liverpool, North Wales, the Isle of Man and Cardiff, where they served on DHQ for seven years.

They first served at THQ in 2007, with Paul as Territorial Evangelism Secretary and Jenine as Mission Development Officer. In 2011 they were appointed as Divisional Leaders in the Central South Division.

Separate appointments followed, with Paul appointed back to THQ as Assistant Secretary for Personnel and Jenine becoming the Divisional Commander of the Central South Division. 18 months later, Jenine was appointed as Divisional Commander of the new North London Division, and Paul as Territorial Secretary for Personnel and Executive Officer for the International Staff Songsters.

In 2018, they were appointed to the Caribbean Territory, Paul as Chief Secretary and Jenine as Territorial Secretary for Women's Ministries.

Returning to the UKI Territory, they took up appointments as Chief Secretary and Territorial Secretary for Leadership Development. On 1st January 2024 they were appointed Territorial Leaders in the United Kingdom & Ireland Territory. They have two married children and four grandchildren. Paul enjoys gardening, while Jenine likes reading, walking, and swimming. They love exploring new places and meeting new people.

Andy Flannagan's album 'Drowning in the Shallow' was described as 'near-perfect' by Cross Rhythms, but he remains disappointingly imperfect. He wrote the critically-acclaimed book 'Those Who Show Up', which has inspired many normal people to get involved in politics and is now the Executive Director of Christians In Politics.

Longing to see the church invest as much in the 'dispersed' as it does in the 'gathered', he is leading on releasing and equipping Christians to be influential in the spheres of culture for the Gather UK Movement. His songs 'We Seek Your Kingdom' and 'Tears and Celebration' have been taking words of worship into the civic space and gleaning huge use around the UK and beyond. His worlds collided perfectly in 2022 when leading worship at the now infamous National Prayer Breakfast that precipitated a change in Government.
