- In vulnerable areas we create plans and strategies with community leaders.

Here are some of the things we are doing in the UK and Ireland to help prevent climate change.

REDUCE

We are **reducing** what we use.

- We are creating community gardens and allotments.
- We pledge to halve our carbon footprint by 2030 and to be 90 per cent net zero by 2040.
- We are becoming eco churches with a commitment to live sustainably.
- We are installing energy saving technology in our buildings, like solar panels, heat pumps and LED lighting.
